Dress Code Information



Why does Dance/10 require a dress code?

Our dress code is designed so faculty can see the dancer's body lines, including posture, arms, legs and feet. Dancers will get the most out of their classes when they follow the dress code.



Do students need to wear dress code?

Students are required to wear dance attire for all classes.



How should hair be styled for class?

Hair should be pulled back, completely out of the students face. Buns are required for ballet classes.



What shoes are needed for class?

The shoes worn in class should be appropriate to the style of class. No street shoes are allowed in the dance studio. Each class has specific requirements. Please see the following pages for additional information.

We want every dancer to be able to access the dress code in a way that allows them to attend their classes in something that keeps them safe and makes them feel comfortable and confident, while providing the faculty the best opportunity to provide constructive feedback on their technique.

Why Does My Dancer Need A Bun?

It is part of dress code. Removes distraction during class. Safety and injury prevention. Buns can help teachers identify technical issues. Aids with balance/control.

What You Will Need

Hairbrush or comb

Large hair elastic (matching hair color)

Nylon hair net (matching hair color)

Thick hairpins (U-shaped): Stronger and better for holding the bun securely.

Bobby pins: Smaller, used for securing the hair net and loose hairs.

Hairspray or gel

All hair should be secured back including whisps, tendrules, and bangs!

How Do I Make a Bun?

Brush and Smooth: Start by brushing your hair to remove any tangles.

Create a Ponytail: Gather your hair into a ponytail at the back of your head or higher. Make sure it's smooth with no lumps, and secure it tightly with a hair elastic.

Position: The ponytail should be at the upper-middle of your head, following the line of your cheekbone.

Tame Wisps: Use hairspray to smooth down any stray hairs.

Twist and Wrap: Twist the ponytail and wrap it around the elastic to form a tight, coiled circle. Secure with hair pins, making sure each pin grabs both the bun and the hair on your head. Use plenty of pins.

Thick Hair Tip: If your hair is thick, split the ponytail in half. Coil one half tightly around the elastic, then wrap the other half around the first coil for a flatter bun.

Secure with a Hair Net: Wrap a hair net around the bun for a snug fit, then secure it with a few extra bobby pins. Finish with hairspray or gel to smooth any remaining flyaways.

Short Hair

Short hair must be secured to the head in the same manner with a small bun if possible. No hair may be hanging in the face.

Please use bobby pins to secure any dangling strands of hair.

Hair

Hair pulled up and neatly secured away from face. Bun is highly encouraged. Ponytail is acceptable.

Leotard

Dancers are required to wear a leotard. They can wear any color and neckline they would like. An attached skirt is optional. No tutus.

Tights

Dancers are required to wear tights (pink, skintone or black are acceptable).

Hair neatly and securely pulled back out of dancer's face. Bun is encouraged. Ponytail is acceptable.

Dance Bag

Attire

Leotard/Unitard Required. Students can wear leggings over leotard or unitard if desired. **NO JEANS, SKIRTS, or DRESSES.**



Dance Shoes



All white sneakers that are **reserved** for class. Shoes need to be clean and free of debris. Jazz shoes acceptable for class.

No Sandals, Uggs, Crocs, Rainboots, or similar.

Bare Feet

No shoes are worn for acrobatics classes.

What should be in my dance bag? Hair ties, Band-aids, Hairnet, bobby-pins, and non-glass water bottle.


